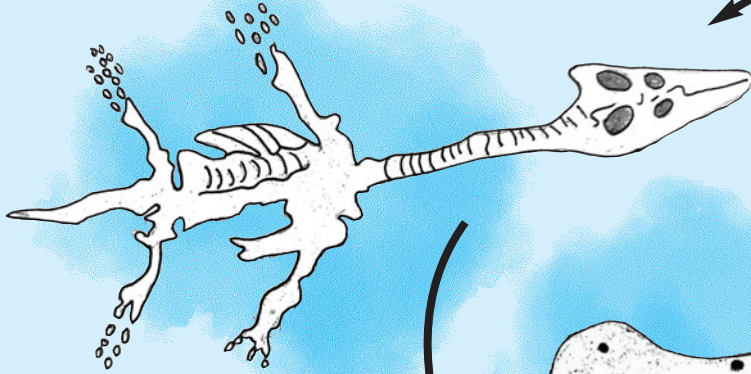

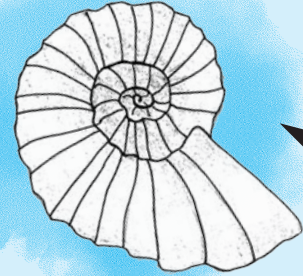
Dinosaurs and Sea Creatures



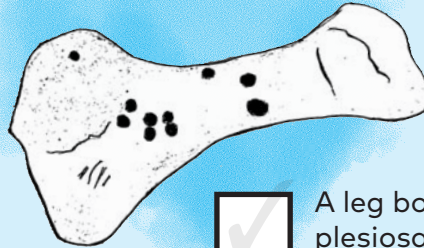
Extinct reptile which lived in water, called an Ichthyosaur. (Ik-thee-oh-saw)
Spot the flippers. These helped them swim through the water.



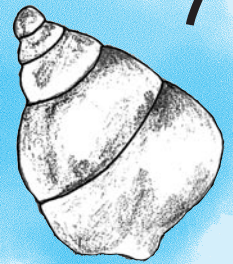
Fossils of sea creatures called ammonites. Some were large and others were tiny.

A leg bone of a plesiosaur showing bite marks.



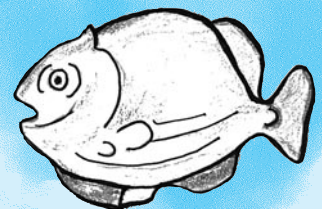
A snail which looked for food on the seabed.



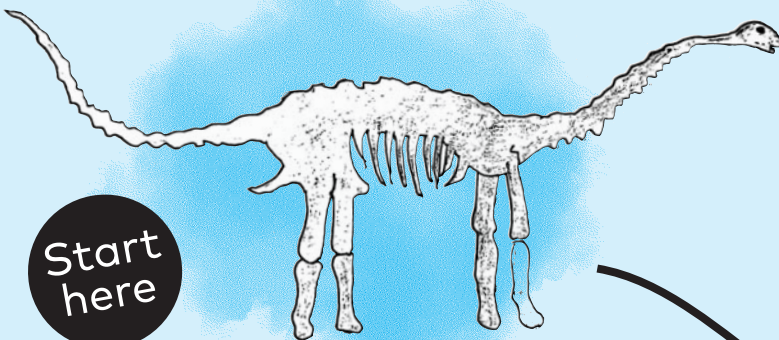
Tooth from a plesiosaur called a Simolestes. (Si-mo-less-teez)



Round shaped fish. Its wide teeth were used for crushing prey.



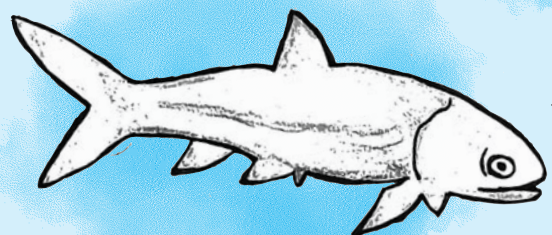
Neovenator. Its name means 'new hunter'. (Nee-oh-ven-a-tor) Its sharp teeth give clues as to what this dinosaur ate.
