Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 curriculum links: Art and Design, Language and Literacy

1. Session Description

Using the German Expressionism collection, *Colourful Portraits* introduces KS1 and KS2 primary school children to the actual work of famous artists from a movement in art history. Through this, they investigate how the artists used colour in portraiture and take part in an art lesson that uses a range of mediums and processes.

2. Session length

90 minutes (1 hour 30 minutes)

4. Learning Outcomes

- To work co-operatively as a group and individually.
- Evaluate and analyse creative works using the language of art, craft, and design.
- Know about great artists, craft makers and designers.
- Develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, shape, lines, and space.
- Use drawing to develop and share ideas, experiences, and imagination.
- Pupils improve their mastery of a range of art and design techniques.
- Recognise and name the primary colours.
- Record from first-hand observation.
- Start to overlay prints with other media.
- Discuss own and others work, expressing thoughts and feelings.

5.Curriculum Links

German Expressionism Gallery at Leicester Museum & Art Gallery.

8. Pre-visit and Post-visit activities

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 cross curricular links:

- ➢ History: Interpret the past from resources.
- Language and literacy: write clearly, accurately, and coherently; handwriting; writing narratives; be competent in speaking and listening, make formal presentations.
- Art: use drawing, painting, and sculpture to develop and share ideas and imagination; develop techniques; use a range of materials creatively to design and make products.

Pre-visit activities

1). Research the German Expressionist artists. Pick a few key artworks and ask the class to think

of a word each to describe how they feel about it.

2). Research and learn about primary colours and complimentary colours.

Post-visit activities

1). Download the colouring-in outline from Leicester Museums & Galleries website of Franz Marc's Red Woman. Experiment colouring it in different colours. How different does it look using different colour palettes?

2). Choose a colour and mix it in different tones and shades. Choose an emotion to which you think each tone or shade matches.
